

JUNIOR FOURSOMES INTERCLUB

The Junior Foursomes competition provides the opportunities for teams to compete in an interclub competition which includes four different formats of the game.

Junior Foursomes has been setup as a developmental competition providing an opportunity for junior players to participate in either a 9 hole or 18 competition that is age and stage appropriate for their ability.

It is important that the children are supported to have a positive experience, adults that are involved as either Team Managers, Duty Team Supervisor or supporting parents should aim to always fall under the Climate of Development, please refer to the Good Sports Spine that is located on the Canterbury Golf website.

Duty Team Supervisor Responsibilities

To assist with the administration of interclub competitions run under Canterbury Golf, the Canterbury Golf Age Group Committee will appoint a duty team for each interclub round.

It is expected that the Duty Team Supervisor is separate to the Team Manager to complete the duties below.

- 1. Collect team sheets from Team Managers 20 minutes before first tee-off
- 2. Check the teams know their starting tees and tee times
- 3. Remind Managers to speak to their team about pace of play and course etiquette
- 4. Set up the results sheets
- 5. Ensure that groups are moving at an appropriate speed throughout the round
- 6. Collect scorecards from each team
- 7. Submit 4BBB scorecards for handicapping
- 8. Ensure all Health and Safety procedures are followed
- 9. Send results sheets to Canterbury Golf the following day by email info@canterburygolf.co.nz

It is important the Duty Team Supervisor for the day encourages a positive and sporting atmosphere.

Any points of debate or conflict should be resolved by the Duty Team Supervisor responsible on the day.

The event should only be called off if the greens are unplayable due to flooding or wind, the Duty Team Supervisor is responsible for making this decision.

Responsibilities of the Team Manager

Each individual team is required to have a manager. A manager may not manage more than one team. Managers Responsibilities are to:

- a) Ensure their team players are eligible to play in this competition.
- b) Ensure the team entry sheet is completed and handed to the host team supervisor at least 20 minutes before teeing off.
- c) Ensure their team is on the tee for their tee time.
- d) Remain with their team for the duration of the round and circulate between team members.
- e) Assist your own team members with learning to complete their scorecard, rules and etiquette as deemed necessary.
- f) Collect and check team cards at the conclusion of the round and sign the result sheet.
- g) To advise both the host team manager and team opposition if your team needs to default a match.
